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CHAIR'S NOTES APRIL 2018

I am pleased to report that Curdridge Parish Council is in the process of hopefully obtaining grant funding from Hampshire County Council under their Parish Lengthsman Scheme. A Lengthsman is a traditional role concerned with looking after local highway matters, including footpaths, ditches and minimal pavement maintenance works. If our application is successful, our Lengthsman will be responsible for looking after our new village gates, clearing litter and leaves from parish council properties abutting the highway, some verge mowing, minimal maintenance of pavements and footpaths and other tasks as they arise. We have already been employing a grounds maintenance contractor to do some of these tasks (as well as other work), but this new grant funding will help stretch our own funds further.

We have also obtained Hampshire County Council grant funding via our Hampshire County Councillor's Grant Funding Scheme for the repair of the tarmac at the vehicular entrance to the Church/Cemetery Car Park. We are aware that other parts

of the car park surface are also in need of repair and we are hoping to use some reserve funds for that purpose, to ensure the car park remains safe for users. The parish council rents the car park from the Diocese, but is wholly responsible for its maintenance.

It has been reported to us that Hampshire County
Council has recently obtained £10 million from central government towards the **Botley By-pass**.
Hampshire County Council are in the process of mobilising other funds, but we do not yet have a firm date for finalising the project. The total cost of the by-pass - from King's Corner to Woodhouse Lane - will be £26 million

Winchester City Council is considering introducing **kerbside glass collection** as part of its commitment to helping residents create a more environmentally friendly district.

Meanwhile, the parish council has a **Voluntary Litter Picking Group** for a similar purpose, who work hard and do a fantastic job of
