# Chair's Notes May 2020

## **The Strangeness Continues**

At the time I'm writing this, we are preparing to hold the Council's AGM via a Zoom Online Meeting. This is the meeting where councillors' roles are set for the following year, and where we make sure all our procedures are still fit for purpose.

Our virtual meeting on 7 May worked well, allowing us to get through the business just as quickly as we could have done round a real table in the Reading Room.

We will wait until the lockdown is over and it is safe to reschedule the Annual Parish Meeting. This meeting is mainly a social event for parishioners to come along and chat to us (and our County & District Councillors if they are in attendance) about issues arising within the parish, whilst also enjoying some light refreshments.

#### Sherecroft

As part of the Botley bypass development, the current owners of land north of the A334 are proposing to develop areas near the future King's Corner roundabout for housing, car parking and commercial properties. This planning has involved public consultation, and the developers have been very receptive to feedback from the Parish Council. Recently, Highwood Planning Consultants responded to the three issues raised by Council in the same positive way that they have worked with us throughout the evolution of the application. In particular, they satisfied us on all three points we raised: 50 space car park near Botley station, electric car charging provision, and an emergency access (in the highly unlikely event that the main entrance is blocked). The Council is happy that these are to be incorporated into the scheme.

# **North Whiteley**

Winchester has proposed a parking restriction on parts of Bluebell Way, to prevent parking near the junctions. Whiteley Town Council is supporting this, and I believe the proposal is reasonable. The opening of Bluebell Way has been delayed by the lockdown, but it should be open by the time you read this.

### **Affordable Housing**

There is now agreement on details of the land to be transferred to build eight affordable homes just north of St Peter's Close, and we are waiting for the Hastoe housing association directors to sign. Winchester has agreed for a direct footpath to the bus stop, and the next stage is surveying. We will be having another Zoom project meeting in June, after which I should know more.
