### Affordable Housing - Botley Road, next to St Peter's Close

Twenty months after our application went in, Winchester City Council has approved plans for eight affordable homes for rent or shared ownership on the southeast side of the B3035. The land was provided in return for consent for a self-build house, placed so that the view from the road will be in keeping with Curdridge's typical low-density appearance.

The project involves Hastoe Housing as developer, assisted by the landowner (Rob Medway), Curdridge Parish Council and Winchester City. It was initiated by Mags Wylie as Senior Rural Housing Enabler at Action Hampshire. The 2011 village questionnaire identified this site as one of the top choices of parishioners.

The delay in getting permission means that the original builder's quotation expired, so Hastoe now has to go out to tender again. In the meantime, construction costs have escalated, so we will need a larger grant from Homes England to get the homes built. The challenge now is to choose a new contractor and get work started on site as soon as possible.

A legal agreement sets out who is eligible to live in the homes, with top priority going to people with a strong connection to the village. This should include children brought up here whose parents are current residents.

# **Curdridge-Whiteley Boundary**

It is now agreed that the new housing in north Whiteley will be part of the Whiteley Town Council area. The new boundary leaves the existing village of Curbridge within Curdridge Parish.

One effect of the change is that residents of north Whiteley will vote in Whiteley rather than at the Reading Rooms. Curdridge PC members were elected last year, but Whiteley Town Council comes up for election this May, as does one of the Winchester City Council seats in our ward.

# News from Hampshire County Council (HCC)

Hugh Lumby, our County councillor, confirms that Hampshire is committed to pushing ahead with the Botley bypass This should provide much needed relief, especially around Curdridge.

HCC has approached the bus company about the proposal that the new 69 bus between Botley Station and Whiteley should stop near the Reading Room.

The site for the new secondary school in Whiteley will be made available this summer. The new school, with 900 places, is expected to be ready for the start of the 2027 academic year.

HCC has received a pre-application enquiry in relation to a possible expansion to the rear of Silverlake garage.
