## Curdridge Transport Crisis - Could You Help?

Since the loss of the X9 bus service, living in Curdridge has become even more difficult for non-drivers. Hampshire has subsidized a new service (Stagecoach 49), but this doesn't connect with buses to Southampton, or with trains to Fareham and Winchester. The result is isolation for young and old, and a real problem for those who cannot shop online.

Curdridge PC is custodian of some funds from the former minibus group, and is seeking ways to help non-driving villagers to get to the shops. We could hire Bishops Waltham's minibus three Tuesdays a month, but lack anyone to drive it (former drivers are now over 70, at which age the class D entitlement fell off our licences).

We have checked if local taxi firms could offer a regular service, but none can commit to providing this. In any case, the retained funds would not last very long unless passengers made substantial contributions.

If you are under 70 and a driver, could you spare time on the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday mornings of each month to drive the BW minibus? If you could, please volunteer to Lynne Newton. If we had a driver and deputy, it might be possible to introduce a fortnightly service to get Curdridge residents to the shops in Hedge End or Whiteley.
