Cricketers Pond - an update

Last month, I wrote that the Parish Council had approved Cllr Sian Townsend's Plan to get the pond back to something the village can be proud of.

Now the Plan has been implemented, and we are very pleased to report that it is working!

The first phase was to fill hessian sandbags with the sand from Cllr Sian Townsend's children's redundant sandpit. These were used to create a barrier; then the space behind it was filled with silt from the pond. This created a filter for the road run-off coming into our pond down the gully that Hampshire Highways had cut through the verge. This should clean out pollutants before they enter our pond, and seems to be working successfully.

Sian and her colleagues filled more sandbags, adding the children's redundant sandpit frame to create a new bank from the sandbag wall to the outer perimeter of the pond. Cllrs Townsend and Haskins worked in the pond, with the assistance of Cllr Newton and Mrs Haskins at the edge. They created the new bank by placing parts of the wooden frame side by side, and placing sandbags at each join to





stabilise the barrier. Then Cllrs Townsend and Haskins – shovel and spade in hand -- lifted and shifted the silt and branches that were in the pond to fill in behind this barrier.

The new bank and the deeper water have been approved by the ducks.

The next phase is to fill the onion bags that villagers kindly donated with plants from Cllrs Newton's and Haskins' garden ponds and place these in the pond. This will oxygenate the water and the roots will bind the remaining silt to create a proper pond bed.



Cllrs Townsend, Haskins and Newton plan to

be back in and by the pond one more time to move the remaining silt, and to plant the plants in the pond and on the newly extended banks. Please visit the pond and watch for greenery and colours appearing as the plants grow and expand.
