Chair's Notes October 2020

Meetings

At the Council's Zoom meeting on 3 September, we decided it is not yet safe to return to physical meetings in the Reading Rooms, and will continue meeting on Zoom throughout October. You can attend these meetings without needing to leave home, by following the link included in the agenda. We had a good turnout of parishioners at the first September meeting, mainly driven by concerns that the removal of the Wangfield Lane railway bridge will lead to even larger vehicles using this route as a rat-run. Church Lane

The Parish Council is responsible for the trees on the Car Park land that we rent from the Church, so had to respond quickly when a large tree fell across the road and into the churchyard. We arranged emergency tree works, and cooperated with Hampshire Highways to remove the fallen tree. Fortunately, the stump fell back into its original position, and has been shortened to make it safe, avoiding an ugly gap in the boundary of the car park.

As well as blocking the road, the fallen tree also damaged a shed on the Church land, and the Council has agreed to provide a replacement, as the old shed was beyond repair.

Bus Shelter

You will have noticed the destruction of the bus shelter on Botley Road, caused by a hit and run collision. The Council felt that we should not simply replace it with another metal shelter, as these clash with the rural nature of the village. The plan is to get a wooden shelter that fits in better with the surroundings, which include the nearby lych-gate at the Church.

Hedgehogs

We are lucky that hedgehogs are sometimes to be seen in the village (though I haven't seen one in our garden for over a year). This useful insectivore is in serious decline across the country, and Roger Huxstep, our County Councillor, has passed on a request to report any sightings on the big hedgehog map at https://bighedgehogmap.org/map-your-hedgehog-sighting

Affordable Housing

The project to build eight affordable houses on the site just north of St Peters Close is moving on slowly. The developer has paid for a pre-application meeting with Winchester Planning, and the architect has submitted a very coherent set of plans and details. The steering group will meet in October to push on towards a formal planning application.
